





How Does Sex Impact Our Emotions?

Feelings may depend on circumstances: Trust partner? Alcohol? Beliefs/values? Contraception/condom? Parents' feelings? Planned? Consent?

Longer Term Feelings Recent research has shown that 50%

of women and 25% men who started to have sex under the age of 18 'wish they had waited longer Discussion
